01. Violence

On average over 125 shootings a year. 2 plus shootings per week.

02. Crisis in Foster Care

40% - 60% of people who are homeless or in prison were once in Foster Care.



03. Increasing Childhood Trauma

We have an increasing number of children testing high in ACE (Adverse Childhood Events)

04. Lack of Drug Rehabilitation


There is over a 6 month wait to start drug treatment

05. Misaligned Resources

The community is not aware of missing needs that need to be filled



South Bend continues to outpace other cities in the country for poverty and violence.



2019 was Covid Lockdown 2022 Police Staff was increased 2023 is only through August

Note: There are still at least 2 SHOOTINGS PER WEEK

In 2023 5 kids have been shot so far, not teens, kids.

Al can offer help with parenting, relationships, conflict resolution and more

04. Online ACE Testing

Immediately identify a child that needs counseling and intervention

05. Resources Guide for Instant

Assistance

Detail 1,600 community resources grouped by their focus


